Santaco plan to launch passenger liner

The South African National Taxi Association's airline made its maiden flight last week when a plane carrying a number of passengers, government officials, businessmen and media representatives flew from Lanseria to Bisho.

The new airline has had to bear the brunt of cartoonists' pens since plans to launch a new scheduled passenger service were announced by the taxi organisation. Of course the major South African company responsible for cargo in South Africa is Safmarine and Jonathan Horn, the company's regional executive for Africa says that the continent continues to be an attractive investment destination for those companies or individuals who are willing to take a long-term view.

He says that Africa needs investors who add value to the people of Africa while providing strong returns for shareholders. Safmarine is a member of the AP Moller-Maersk Group.
