

Cape Town railway station to close platforms for system upgrade

Several platforms at Cape Town railway station are expected to close from 26 January until 30 January 2019 to allow for a signal system's upgrade.

According to Riana Scott, the Metrorail spokesperson, the upgrade is scheduled to take place from Saturday, 26 January until Wednesday, 30 January 2019.

Commuters should note that Platforms 1-12, as well as Platform 24, will be closed for the five days while the commissioning work is being conducted.

This is the second phase of re-signalling work at Cape Town station, which involves replacing the old heavily copper-reliant signalling system with a new electronic type of system.

"The re-signalling project is vital to address obsolescence in the rail network. The current signal system is old, heavily copper-reliant and therefore prone to metal theft and vandalism." Metrorail said in a statement.

The statement says "This new electronic type of signalling relies less on copper technology, provides enhanced operational flexibility and improves operating safety. It has the added advantage that it can be remotely controlled from the recently completed nerve centre in Bellville."

The first phase of the upgrade, which included Platforms 13-16, 20-23, was completed ahead of schedule in December 2018. Platforms 17, 17 and 19 remain closed for repairs and will be commissioned later.
